USING DAVIS LIBRARY

Carrels

Faculty, graduate students, and those undergraduates working on honor's theses are eligible for a carrel. Apply online or at the Circulation Desk.

Computing

In addition to the public computers located throughout the 1st and 2nd floors, laptops are available for checkout and an ITS computer lab is located on the 3rd floor for UNC affiliates.

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and Data Services

Specialized reference assistance is available to help researchers create maps or perform spatial analysis using a GIS as well as identify, evaluate, and access numeric data.

Group Study Rooms

Located on the 4th through 8th floors, several group study rooms can be reserved through the Circulation Desk.

Services for Patrons with Disabilities

How to Read an LC Call Number:

LB: Read the first line in alphabetical order: A, B, C...L, LA, **LB**, LC, LD, M, N, O P, PR, PS.

2395: Read as a whole number: 1, 2, 3, 100, 101, 200, 2000, **2395**, 2400, 3000...

.C657: Read the letters alphabetically, the numbers as a decimal: **.C657** = .657, .C72 = .72

1991: The last line is the year the book was published. Read in chronological order (not all books have this line): 1924, 1925, 1985, **1991**, 2004

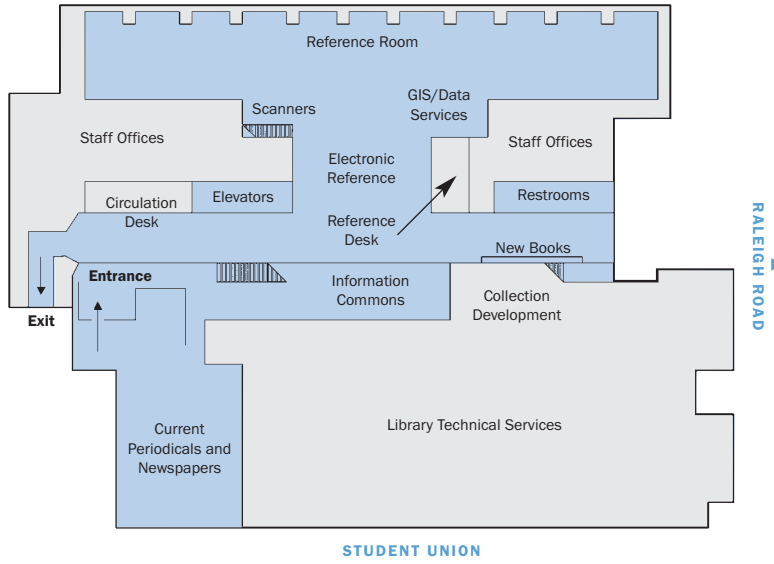


PUBLIC AREAS *in* DAVIS LIBRARY

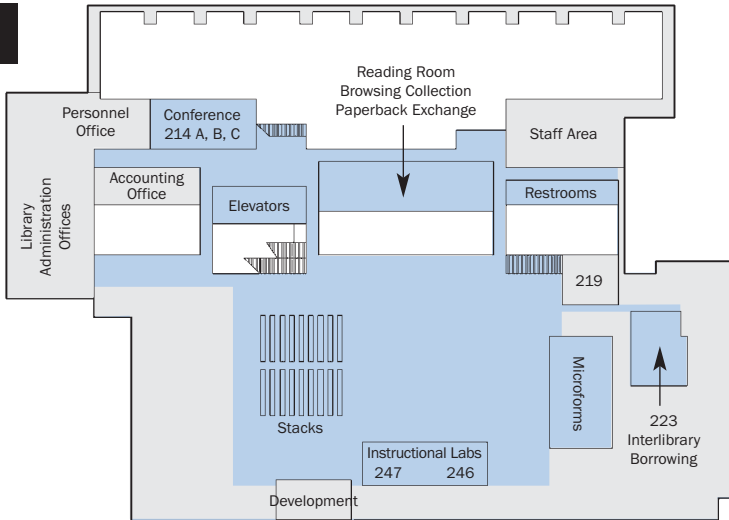
FIRST FLOOR



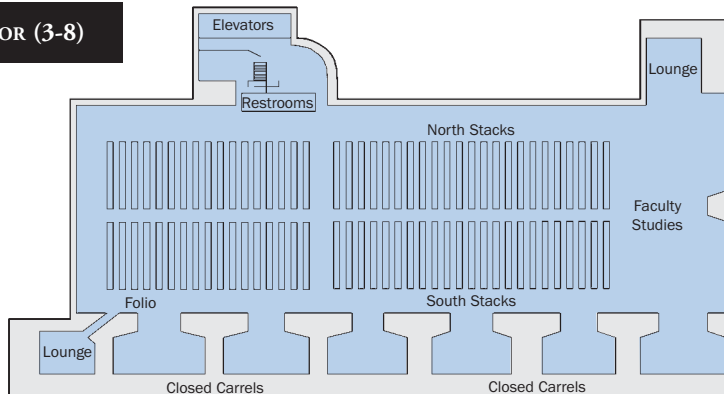

The North Carolina Collection in Wilson Library has non-circulating print copies of all UNC-Chapel Hill dissertations.

Folios (Oversized Volumes Folios & Folio2s):

Shelved in the SW (right rear) corner of the stacks on the appropriate floor for the call number. Exception: Folio and Folio2 AC-AZ are on the 3rd Floor with Folios B-DD.

Storage: Items in Storage must be paged. Request forms are at the Circulation Desk or at: <http://www.lib.unc.edu/eforms.html>.

Microforms: All microfilm, microfiche, microprint, and microcards with call numbers in Dewey or LC, beginning with 1- (i.e. Microfiche Serial 1-8281) are in the Microforms Collection on the 2nd floor.

Magazines/Journals: Periodicals with call numbers are shelved with the book collection. Current issues are shelved in the Serials Room on the 1st floor. Ask at Circulation for items with Storage as their location.

Government Documents/Maps: Items are located in the Reference Room (1st floor) and in the basement. Ask staff for assistance.

Reference: Items are shelved in the Reference Room (1st floor) or at the Reference Desk. Ask staff for assistance.

Book Finding Assistance: If the book or periodical you are looking for is not on the shelf, ask for help at the Circulation Desk.
